City street meters: 60 cents

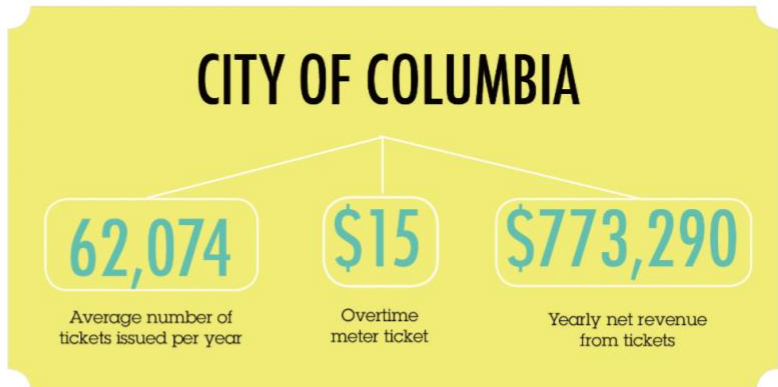
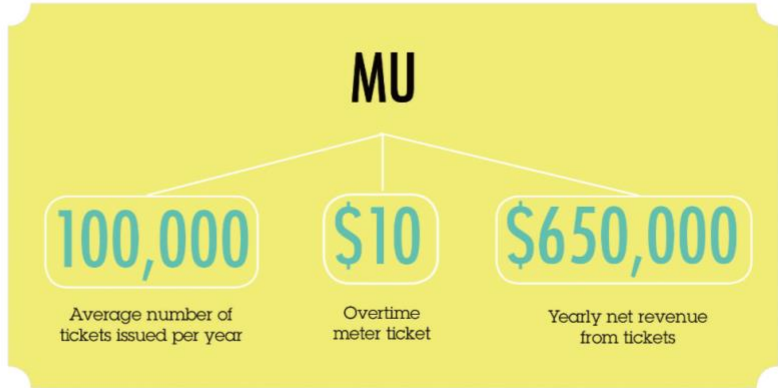
Uncovered city garage permits: \$3.25
