





| Explanations   | Examples   |

| Noun participial phrase fragments often begin with a word ending in "ing" or "ed," which results in a missing main clause. | ★ Jumping over the puddle.     ✓ Children are jumping over the puddle.   |
| Fix awkward-sounding fragments or run-ons with correct punctuation or conjunctions.  | The pin is hers, the hat is mine.  The pin is hers, and the hat is mine. |

| Put adjectives in this order: opinion-size-age-shape- color-origin-material- purpose. | ➤ The <u>blue square, large</u> box is mine.  ✓ The <u>large square</u> , blue box is mine.   |
| Pronoun agreement must match the noun it replaces in number, place, and gender.       | <ul> <li>✓ Alice, that does my hair, has moved to another hairdresser.</li> <li>✓ Alice, who does my hair, has moved to another hairdresser.</li> </ul> |

### Answers | Sentence Structure



### **Explanations**

Dangling modifiers are words, phrases, or clauses that describe something that has been left out of the sentence.

### **Examples**

**X** While walking to work, a taxi ran a stop sign.

Coordination links words, clauses, or sentences of equal type/importance, while subordination emphasizes which are most important.

LaTosha enjoyed those special moments when a group of students who also came from Northern Oklahoma visited her dorm, which was lonely for most of the school year.

Because LaTosha's dorm was lonely most of the school year, she enjoyed those special moments when a group of students who also were from Northern Oklahoma would visit.
