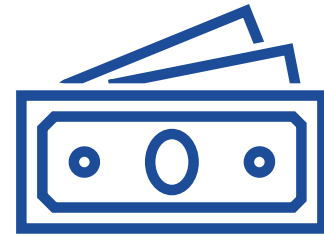


OVERCOMING CHALLENGES

Financial: *How Do I Pay for a PSE?*

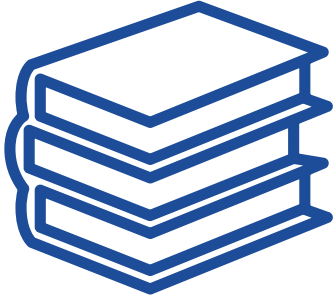
There are several options available to pay for your education after high school.



Term	Definition
Pell Grant	money from the federal government based on need; this money does not need to be repaid
Loan	money borrowed from the federal government or from private sources; this money must be repaid with interest
Scholarship	money awarded for good grades, talents, or achievements; this money does not need to be repaid
Work Study	a program that lets qualifying students earn money through part-time jobs, often on-campus, while in school
Oklahoma's Promise	money from the state government to cover tuition and fees that is awarded based on need, academic requirements, and residency; this money does not need to be repaid
FAFSA	the free form you complete to apply for financial aid
