

## SCHOLARSHIP SCAVENGER HUNT

Think of scholarships as FREE money! Scholarships can be in the form of a tuition waiver, fee waiver, or money paid directly to the postsecondary education (PSE) program or to the student. Most scholarships require the student to apply for the award.

There are typically three different types of scholarships: 1) scholarships found using Big Search Engines; 2) College Specific scholarships found on campus websites; and 3) Community or local scholarships found in a variety of ways.
