Term	Definition	Examples
Prepositional Idioms	An expression where the preposition is part of the idiom. These expressions are ones where a given word must be followed by a <u>certain</u> preposition in order to maintain meaning.	They are deathly afraid of spiders. I am interested in learning. She feels responsible for the project.
Infinitive Idioms	Expressions that contain a verb followed by the infinitive form ("to eat," "to run," "to sleep," etc.) of another verb.	I plan to attend the meeting tomorrow. I forgot to bring my laptop. We hoped to win the game.
Gerund Idioms	Expressions that contain a verb followed by a gerund (a verb that functions as a noun and typically ends in "-ing.")	He stopped playing basketball last year. They considered moving out of state. I enjoy reading historical fiction.
