To Whom It May Concern:

The United States Department of Education and the Access Board, a federal agency, are starting a new ADA initiative to make certain that all high school campuses in the United States are wheelchair accessible. - 4. Write a letter back to the U.S. Department of Education and the Access Board, stating what you did, what you found, and whether the ramps are acceptable.
