COSTA'S LEVELS OF QUESTIONING

LEVEL 1 (Lower-Order Thinking: Comprehension)

The reader can find the answer to a question within the text. The reader can "put his finger on the answer" in one spot. These are right and wrong answers.

Define Describe Identify Complete List Name Recite Observe Select

LEVEL 2 (Inferencing/Making Text Connections)

The reader infers answers from what the text states, possibly in several places.

Sort Distinguish Compare Contrast Synthesize Analyze Group Infer

LEVEL 3 (Higher-Order Thinking: Application)

The reader thinks beyond what the text states based on prior experiences or knowledge. There is not necessarily a right or wrong answer, but some answers are better than others.

Apply Evaluate Hypothesize Imagine Judge If/Then Predict Speculate
