

"OVERTHROW WORLD ORDER!" CRY COMMUNISTS

Manifesto of Communist International, Seized in U.S. Department of Justice Raids, Tells "Reds" Own Story of Their Plans for World Wide Plunder.

Extracts from "Manifesto of the Communist International"—Adopted at the Congress of the Communist International at Moscow, March 24, 1919, and signed by Cominternade C. Rakovsky, N. Lenin, M. Zinoviev, L. Trotsky and Fritz Platten.

Among the most important features of the Bolshevik, Ukrainian and Hungarian, and the capitalist cliques of these lands, the rulers of France, England, Italy and the United States stand revealed in the light of unfolding events as the chief enemies of the working-class movement.

Rising up the half-heartedly, hypocritically and corruptly of the decadent official socialist parties we, the Communists assembled in the Third International, call upon all the workers of the world to unite their efforts and martyrs of a long series of revolutionary generations from Baku to Karl Liebknecht and Rosa Luxemburg. As the first great international gathering of the working-class and proletarian masses, as the Second International gathered together and organized millions of the proletarians, so the Third International gathers together and organizes billions of the working-class and proletarian masses throughout the world, the international of democracy, the international of justice. Socialist criticism has sufficiently agitated the bourgeois world order. The task of the International Communist Party is to lead the working-class to the overthrow of the bourgeoisie and the creation of the socialist world order. We urge the working men and women of all countries to unite under the Communist banner, the emblem of the first great international of the working-class.

Proletarians of all lands! In the war against imperialism, the bourgeois world is waging a fierce struggle against the bourgeois world, against all forms and varieties of social and national oppression.—UNITED!

The International of the Comintern, under the banner of the "Third International," is in the revolutionary struggle for power and the dictatorship of the Proletariat; proletarians of all countries, unite! The International of the Comintern calls upon all to make use of the means of battle which will concentrate its entire energy, namely, mass action, with the logical result, direct and uncompromising struggle with the bourgeoisie, with its constant and frequent use of bourgeois parliamentary methods, will be of secondary significance.

The International of the Comintern struggle is separation not only from the direct services of Capitalism and enemies of the communist revolution, in which role the Social-Democrats of the Right appear, but also from the Social-Democrats of the Left, who are the main force of the critical moment in order to come to terms with our own antagonists.

The growth of the revolutionary movement in all lands, the forces of suppression of the bourgeoisie, the intervention of the imperialistic States, the attempts of the Socialist bourgeois to make up the losses (the formation of the International Socialist Bureau, the International Socialist League, etc.), the absolute necessity for co-operation of proletarian actions—all these demand the formation of a real revolutionary and revolutionary international. The International of the Comintern, which is the embodiment of the so-called socialist interests to the interests of the international revolution, will permit the most rapid help of the proletariat of the world to the working-class of all countries. The International of the Comintern will not be able to organize the new society.

The bourgeoisie of all countries, the leaders of the working class, their best-known, from Luxemburg they have lost. Against this the proletariat must defend itself, defend it and win it. The Communist International calls the entire working-class to the struggle.
