Poem with Two Voices

What is it?

This is a poem written and performed by two people. The poem usually has two columns -one for each person reading the poem. More interesting poems have a refrain throughout the poem that both participants would say together. If done correctly the poem sounds like a dialogue between two people.

How do I write a poem for two voices?

A topic should be provided for the students. The best choices are primary source materials or visual images that can help generate ideas. With a writing partner begin to generate words/phrases that come to mind when reading a document or analyzing an image. Then students begin to craft the poem in two columns keeping in the back of your mind a possible refrain for your poem. You can also start with a Venn diagram graphic organizer.

How is a poem with two voices performed?

Students in teams of two stand and recite their poem. It helps if they are side by side so they can read off of the same document. You will be amazed at the skills of your students.
