<p>The snake is “milked” for venom.</p>	<p>Venom is injected into a horse whose immune system starts making antibodies.</p>
<p>Some blood is withdrawn from the horse.</p>	<p>After getting additional booster shots of venom over a year, the horse produces many antibodies.</p>
<p>Snakebite patients get vials of antivenom through an IV.</p>	<p>Blood is spun in a lab and separated into plasma and blood cells. The plasma, containing antibodies, is kept.</p>
<p>Plasma is sent to a lab, purified, and packaged into individual vials.</p>
