To accompany reading of "Identity" by Julio Noboa Polanco

What kind of people do you think are the "flowers," and what are Polanco's feelings toward the "flowers" of our society? (Use evidence here, too.)

*Now, consider what an "extended metaphor" is. Is Polanco's metaphor of himself as a weed effective? What does it say about him as a person?
