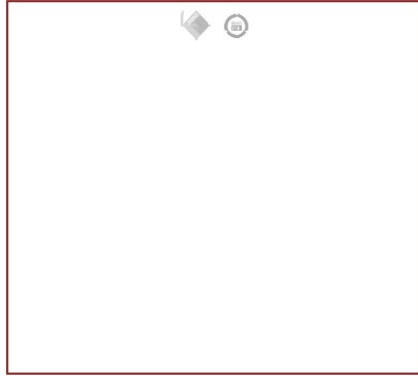

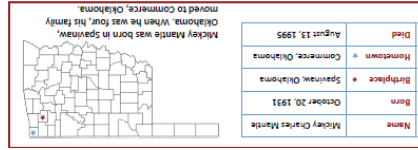

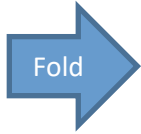

Assembling



Mickey Mantle started his career playing for the Baxter Springs Whiz kids. A scout from the Yankees came to watch a game. While he was there, he saw Mickey hit three home runs in one game. He offered him a spot to play on a minor league baseball team. When he graduated from high school, he signed a contract.

Mickey Mantle was a famous baseball player. He would often say that his best year was 1956. That year he won many awards and became known as the hero of the World Series. In Game 5 of the series, Don Larsen pitched a perfect game. If it wasn't for a great catch by Mickey, that never would have happened!
