Student-Centered Opportunities	 ask students to create a product that integrates or represents their learning in a unique way? ask students to share ideas and respond to the ideas of others? allow students to make choices about their learning environment (content, process, or product)? allow students to assess or critique their own work?
Rigor Opportunities	 provide students with opportunities to develop and use higher-order thinking (HOT) skills (organizing, synthesizing, interpreting, integrating, evaluating)? use meaningful questions to guide student learning? ask students to construct a supported explanation or argument? ask students to negotiate a group understanding of a concept or idea?
Relevant Opportunities	 allow students to make personal connections with the learning activities? address a topic or problem that has real-world implications?
Engaging Opportunities	 place students in the role of active rather than passive learners? use formative assessment to link prior knowledge with new knowledge?
