

FIRST TURN / LAST TURN

Summary

Working in small groups, students collaborate to identify key ideas, themes, and concepts from a reading. This structure specifically encourages students to take turns offering their insights on the text without interrupting others and serves as a guide to help students learn to converse productively in a group.

Procedure

- 1. Form groups of four to eight.
- Silently and simultaneously, ask members to read a section of text and highlight three or four items that have particular meaning for them.
- 3. Name a person to start in each group.
- 4. Have students share one of their highlighted items during their turn, but do not comment on it. They simply name it.
- 5. Invite the other group members in round-robin style to comment about that item with no cross-talk.
- 6. Have the student who shared the highlighted text take a turn speaking last, sharing his or her reasons for highlighting the item and thoughts that may have arisen as a result of the discussion.
- Repeat the pattern around the table, with each person sharing one of their highlighted items so that each member has the opportunity to comment on every person's statement.
