Summary

Do you have a green thumb? If you like working with plants and flowers, you might be interested in a career in floral design. Floral designers bring joy to others through their work. Floral design is more than just being able to grow or cut plants. Floral designers also know the meaning behind flowers to make sure they provide the right blooms for the right occasion. How does someone become a floral designer? What kinds of work do they do? These activities will help you to better understand the skills needed to be a floral designer.

Overview

Career Title: Floral Designer

What career cluster does this fall under? Marketing, Sales, and Services

What do floral designers do? Floral designers arrange flowers to express a message. They serve their customers by providing what they need for any occasion. Customer service and communication skills are key as you work closely with others to provide exactly what they need.

What skills are essential if you want to enter this career?

- Communication: Floral designers have to be able to work with customers to figure out both what they need and what they can afford.
- Creativity: Floral designers need to be able to create works of art by using a variety of plants.
- Dependability: Floral designers have to get their creations to events and places on time. Customers count on them.
- Detail-oriented: Customers expect specific arrangements. It is critical that a floral designer deliver exactly what the customer expects.
- Self-motivated: Floral designers must stay on task and finish a project. Since floral designers may also run their own businesses, it is essential that they are able to set goals and achieve them.

What type of education do you need to succeed in this career field?

Some college education is preferred. If you have a goal of running your own business, a college degree will provide the skills needed to help you succeed.

What is the average salary for this career field?

\$30,000/year

What to Do

These activities will help you will learn more about the work of a floral designer. You will match flowers to their meaning, hear from a floral designer about what the work is like from day to day, and design your own arrangement. You can also improve your "green thumb" by learning tips and tricks for preserving flowers as the professional floral designers do.

Activity #1 Finding Flower Meanings

Did you know that every flower has a special meaning?

People used to (and sometimes still do) give flowers based on their meaning. It is helpful for a floral designer to know the meaning behind certain flowers so they don't send the wrong message. Test your flower knowledge in this matching game.

Activity 3 - Design an Arrangement

Some floral designers build their creations from the flowers in their shop, designing as they go, but other times it may be important to sketch out designs for a client to approve. Designing floral arrangements for a big event requires a designer be imaginative and creative.

The video series linked below walks through the process of sketching out a variety of flowers so you can design your own arrangements. You can watch just one or two of the videos or watch the entire series. The third video in the series offers great tips for designing a bouquet and bringing a lot of different flowers together.

After practicing along with the videos, draw your finished design on the attached **Floral Design Page** or on your own paper.
