Loom for Education is free for qualified educators. With Loom for Education, teachers can get unlimited access to recordings and access to premium features for free. As videos are recorded, educators will be able to build a library of content that can be categorized. Loom runs on either a web browser or phone app.

Using Loom

- 1. Download the Loom app or browser extension.
- 2. Select the Loom icon on the browser bar, or open the app.
- 3. Choose the desired settings, and then click "start recording."
- When finished recording, click the green checkmark at the bottom of the screen, and edit the recorded video as necessary.
- 5. Use one of the sharing options, download, or copy the link.
- 6. Share!
